For the past two years, Fiddlers ReStrung has provided a great kickoff to the Saline Fire Department's Toys for Tot's campaign drive. After collecting 150 toys in 2007 and over 1000 in 2008, the expectations are again high for this year's Fiddlers ReStrung's Holiday Hometown Concert in Support of Toys for

Tots. In a year when the local economy has suffered terribly, the ability to make a difference with a toy makes this concert all the more powerful. And during a year where many of the Fiddlers ReStrung performances were dedicated to community service, this concert provides a most fitting way to ring in the holiday season.

The concert features a collage of local com-



munity talent. Opening performances include the Saline Area School's 6th Grade Fiddle Club, directed by Fiddlers ReStrung Assistant Artistic Director Cori Smith, as well as the School's 7th and 8th Grade Fiddle Club, led by Fiddlers ReStrung Artistic Director Josh Herter. Also performing on stage will be select members of the Saline High School Choir and Saline High School Band, all of whom have graciously offered to donate their time and talent to this special event. Fiddlers ReStrung's Holiday Hometown in Support of Toys for Tots

The Saline Fire Dept. has hosted a toy collection to benefit children identified through Saline Social Services for many years. It was eight years ago that Saline firefighter and U.S. Marine Corps Reservist Kurt Schneider initiated the fire department's alliance with the U.S. Marine Corps Reserves' Toys for Tots program. Shortly thereafter, Fire Chief Craig Hoeft invited the Fiddlers ReStrung to perform at the fire station on the first day of the toy collection campaign. This concert has grown from that ini-

tial collaboration and is becoming an annual tradition in Saline. "Because of the relationship between two great organizations the less fortunate families of Saline will have an opportunity for a better Christmas," Hoeft said about this event.

tiative began in 1947 when the wife of Major Bill Hendricks, USMCR, handcrafted a Raggedy Ann doll and asked her husband to deliver the doll to an organization that would give it to a needy child at Christmas. Finding that no such agency existed, Major Hendricks took it upon himself, along with a group of Marine Reservists, to form one. In the first year alone, they collected and distributed over 5,000 toys to needy children. The following year, Toys for Tots became a nationwide campaign. A Marine Reservist on weekends, Major Hendricks was in civilian life the Director of Public Relations for Warner Brothers Studio. As such, he was able to convince a vast array of celebrities to support the



program. Walt Disney designed the Toys for Tots logo in 1948, which is still used today. The primary goal has remained the same since its inception: deliver a shiny, new toy at Christmas to America's needy children as a message of hope.

In the spirit of the Toys for Tots campaign, Fiddlers ReStrung encourages everyone attending the concert to bring a new, unwrapped toy to contribute to the drive. Marines from Selfridge Air Force Base will be on hand to accept your donation. Donations can also be dropped off at the fire station any day after the concert date up until December 19th.

Fiddlers ReStrung Summer Reading Program

Saline, Michigan: On October 21, 2009, the Fiddlers ReStrung were recognized by the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners for their Summer Reading Program for Michigan Libraries. The program, which ran for the first time in 2009, featured an engaging interactive and educational performance format, where ReStrung performers shared stories about their own musical background and the musical selections they perform with the audience. In each concert during this series, the audience was not only invited to ask questions about the songs,



the instruments and the group, but some lucky children in the audience were invited up to join Re-Strung during the show-ending number, the Orange Blossom Special, each with a percussion instru-



ment.

In bestowing this citation on Fiddlers ReStrung, County Commissioner Kristin Judge said, "Over the summer, Commissioner Sizemore and I were talking about all the negative news that we had coming to the Board, and we thought it might be fun to find some positive things happening in our community." She added, "

of the folks involved in this community group, the Saline Area School's Fiddlers ReStrung, and they were telling me about how they were doing their part, to help in this economy to bring positive activities to the community."

The Fiddlers ReStrung Summer Library Program

The goal in providing these concerts for public libraries is to give back to the communities in the state of Michigan and provide enriching musical performances to support summer reading programs. For Michigan libraries, Fiddlers ReStrung lowered its performance fee considerably, recognizing the challenging budgetary constraints faced by many of these institutions. While ReStrung's funds are primarily made from concert performances earned throughout the year, the decision to reduce fees for organizations in greater need shows the stellar character of the group. Through this program, the students in Fiddlers ReStrung learned about civic engagement in a way that could never be taught in the classroom. They also learned how the gift of music can make a tremendous contribution to com-

munities across Michigan during these trying economic times.

The Participating Libraries included: Howell Carnegie District Library; Saline District Library; Homer District Library; Stair Public Library (Morenci); Fred C. Fischer Library (Belleville); White Lake Township Library; St. Clair County Library (Port Huron); Albion Public Library; Baldwin Public Library (Birmingham) & Cromaine Library (Hartland).
