History of Toys for Tots

TOYS FOR TOTS

Toys for Tots is a program run by the United States Marine Corps Reserve which distributes toys to children whose parents cannot afford to buy them gifts for Christmas. The program was founded in 1947 by reservist Major William L. Hendricks. William was inspired by his wife Diane when she tried to donate a homemade Raggedy Ann doll to a needy child but could find no organization to do so. At her suggestion he gathered a group of local Marine reservists, including Lieutenant Colonel John Hampton, who coordinated and collected some 5,000 toys for local children that year from collection bins placed outside of Warner Bros. movie theaters. Their efforts were so successful that, in 1948, Toys For Tots was launched as a national campaign. Hendricks used his position as director of Public Relations for Warner Brothers Studio to enlist celebrity support, as well as have Walt Disney Studios design the red toy train logo.

Each donation counts! Over 98% of donations made to Toys for Tots go to the mission of providing toys, books and other gifts to less fortunate children. The 2% spent on support principally covers fundraising expenses - not one donated dollar goes to pay for salaries or any other manpower costs.

About Fiddlers ReStrung

Fiddlers Restrung is currently a 22 member group made up of students from Saline High School. Focused on generating a genuine live performance, the ensemble relies on the musical and personal maturity, improvisational skills and spontaneity of its students.

Fiddlers ReStrung portrays a diverse arrangement of styles; ranging from traditional bluegrass and Celtic fiddle to a newer, progressive acoustic sound. Students work alongside the artistic leadership to arrange new repertoire and share in crafting their ensemble. This collaborative ownership encourages the students to be themselves and share their own ideas while challenging them to be open to new musical experiences. Participation and improvisation are two key elements of Fiddlers ReStrung.

Fiddlers ReStrung has frequent performances at high visibility paid events such as fairs, private fundraisers, country music festivals and at pro bono events such as schools, senior centers and others.

Hats "n" Horses Summer Tour 2012

Fiddlers ReStrung members were "all aboard the bus" complete with gear, musical instruments and tons of enthusiasm to take their high energy entertainment on their annual summer tour on June 27th, 2012. This year's tour was labeled the "Hats 'N' Horses Tour" and took the group throughout the upper Midwest states, featuring a performance at Mount Rushmore. The group returned on July 9 upon completing ten performances during their visits to eight states. The trip also provided educational activities such as tours of Fort Abraham Lincoln, Black Hills Caverns and the Crazy Horse Memorial. There were also "downtime" excursions such as a visit to The Mall of America, the Corn Palace and a riverboat cruise.
