Fiddlers ReStrung's Colony Coast Tour
Summer 2011 (June 26th to July 6th, 2011)

Fiddlers ReStrung "got on the bus" with all their gear, musical instruments and personal effects to take their high-energy entertainment on their annual summer tour Sunday, June 26. This year's tour was booked as the "Colony Coast Tour" and took the group to the historic roots of the U.S. republic in Philadelphia, New York City, Connecticut and Boston. Before returning home on July 6, the group made a stop in Pittsburgh for a tour of Carnegie Mellon University and a noon performance on campus there.



Highlights of this year's tour included a rehearsal audit with the Boston Pops Orchestra on July 3 as the symphony prepared for its annual July Fourth concert in the city called "The Cradle of Liberty." Fiddlers ReStrung members also attended a workshop with renowned Irish fiddler, Sheila Falls, while in Boston that day. The tour included performances in a variety of venues in Philadelphia, Madison, CT, Pittsburgh and West Mifflin, PA. According to Marielle Driskell, a senior member of the FRS group,

There is possibly no family crisis more devastating than facing the challenge of coping with the care and treatment of a critically ill child. When the new C. S. Mott Children's Hospital opens in November, it will include 12 private Ronald McDonald House rooms for the families of the hospital's most critically ill children.

To celebrate the partnership between C.S. Mott and the Ronald McDonald House of Ann Arbor, the two organizations hosted a Festival of Hope on Main Street in Ann Arbor on June 23. Ronald McDonald was on hand for photo opportunities, and Fiddlers ReStrung provided musical entertainment. Originally scheduled to perform outdoors on the closed-to traffic Main Street stage, the event was hastily moved indoors to Conor O'Neill's Celtic Room to escape the inclement weather.

The audience contributed to the ambiance of the occasion, with at least one young fan offering to join the group as a bongo player. "She loves drums," her mother explained.
